## From the Rabbi Rabbi Cy Stanway

The Days of Awe are both the most rewarding and the most challenging time of the year. This is the time when our souls are reflected inwardly and our determination is focussed outwardly. Faced with the ultimate questions, we reflect on where our lives have been and where they are going.

I am certainly in that spiritual space.

Each of us has his or her own ups and downs for this past year and there is plenty to reflect on about both the past and the future. As for me, this has been a most challenging year.

I suffered the pain of a dear friend's suicide, the death of a beloved father-in-law and other challenging moments known to only a few. I do not share this with you in a bid for sympathy. I share it with you because I want you to know that I know where you are coming from (and maybe to remind us all that we are all humans). Your challenges and your pain is real as you enter these Days of Awe and I understand.

Often we come to a service and hope that the rabbi will say the right words that will give us another year of life, a year of health and a year of prosperity. I have heard it many times over the course of the past 30 years that only the words spoken by the rabbi have any effect. Although I am flattered by the idea, I must disagree with it.

We need to pray as a community supporting each other, forgiving each other and offering forgiveness to one another. We will pray together. I won't pray in your stead. You can take my hand and we can walk together, and we should. In that way, my words along with yours will ascend to the Ancient of Days and we will pray for the blessings of a new year, the strength to overcome the challenges the face us, the comfort we seek to soothe the pain of loss and the joy that comes from a new opportunity given by God to move forward on a path of blessings and possibilities.



The mood during the Days of Awe are somber. Those who suffer often are. But this somberness dissipates as the gates begin to close. The setting sun on Yom Kippur is a metaphor that the days of challenge are beginning to fade and the stars that appear are metaphors that, even in the darkness, there is abundant light. We will arise from these Days of Awe refreshed and renewed and facing the future with hope and possibility. The sounds of the shofar will rouse us to awakesness and the

prayers lead us to reflection and action. We will arise renewed.

Stella, Abraham, Naomi, SaraAnn and I wish you a most meaningful holy day season. May we all be inscribed in the Book of Life for blessing and may each of our entries into that book be a blessing for us, our families, our friends and our community.

One of my most fond memories of High Holiday services at my childhood synagogue on Long Island was singing in the youth choir with the Cantor and my friends during the youth service. The moment I looked forward to the most was on Yom Kippur morning when we would sing V'al Kulam. As an elementary and middle school aged student, I had no idea what the words meant, but I knew how the sound of them made me feel. The sound was grand and important. Cantor Barr would sing, "V'al kulam, elo-ah s'lichot" (For all these, O God of mercy) and we would respond with, "S'lach lanu, m'chal lanu, ka-peir lanu" (forgive us, pardon, grant us atonement). As a budding singer, I wanted to sing the solo line that he sang with such fervor, but I knew it wasn't my time (yet).

The years went by, and I would again find myself feeling at home with that prayer and tune by Abraham W. Binder when I started Cantorial School at HUC in 2001. When I began my student pulpit the following year, I would finally have my turn to sing the entire V'al Kulam myself. Every year since then, I have had the opportunity to sing it—and sing all of it. When I sing it, I can still feel the emotions stirring in me as they did when I was a child at that poignant moment in the service.

I hope that you and your families make special memoires during the High Holidays at TBM that you carry with you and share with your children and grandchildren.

anonymous donor who donated the ice cream truck where people had their fill of ice cream treats. The 180 people joined us for this special service had a wonderful evening.

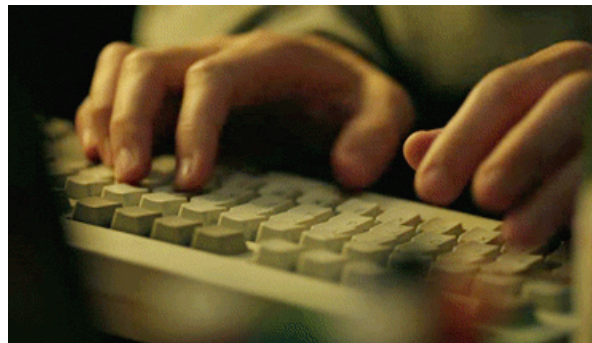
